V2X technology enables vehicles to communicate with each other, with other road and with roadside users, infrastructure, through wirelessly exchanged messages.

"ITE recognizes that V2X technology is an important tool in our efforts to reach zero deaths on our roadways," said Steve Kuciemba, ITE Executive Director and CEO.
